**Nunawading Kangas Basketball Club** is a community based junior club established over 30 years ago. Our players are drawn from Nunawading and the surrounding suburbs. Our aim is to provide an environment for our players to enjoy sport whilst improving their skills, learning about teamwork and respect for other players, coaches and referees. Older players have the opportunity to develop leadership skills through coaching younger teams.

We are part of the Melbourne East Basketball Association and have over 500 players (over 60 teams) playing in the Junior Domestic Competitions.

### **Rationale of this policy:**

Nunawading Kangas recognises the jurisdiction of the Melbourne East Basketball Association tribunal for the review and discipline of all players, coaches and other Club representatives reported to that body. However, on occasions, issues with behaviour that are outside the parameters of the tribunal may arise and the purpose of this policy is to clarify how these issues will be handled by the Club.



## **STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOUR**

All members of Nunawading Kangas Basketball Club, including players, their families, coaches, Committee members are expected to abide by the Codes of Conduct as stipulated by the Melbourne East Basketball Association and Basketball Victoria. Families of registering players are required to indicate they agree to this requirement when they register and coaches are required to sign an agreement to comply. Nunawading Kangas has put in place a Behavioural Standards Sub-Committee to review incidents where behaviour falls outside the Codes of Conduct.

## **ROLE OF THE BEHAVIOURAL STANDARDS SUB-COMMITTEE**

The Behavioural Standards Sub-Committee's role is to:

- Receive, review and act as required on notifications from the Whistle App (technical fouls called on Nunawading Kangas players or coaches)
- Investigate and as as required on any complaints received regarding player, coach or spectator behaviour
- Receive any issues relating to Child Protection
- To report on the outcome of their investigations of behavioural issues to the Committee.

## **MEMBERSHIP OF THE BEHAVIOURAL STANDARDS SUBCOMMITTEE:**

The membership of the Behavioural Standards Sub-Committee will include:

- The Child Safety Officer or if role is not filled the Club President
- Other members of the Committee or nominated Club representatives
